1	5	<p>Drowning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advise students to stay away from quayside
2	5	<p>Traffic</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advise groups to stick to the pavement and use pedestrian crossings where possible • Warn groups that the high street is not pedestrianised
3	6	<p>Weather</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check weather forecast prior to session • Advise group on appropriate clothing • Advise groups to wear hat/sun cream if necessary • Advise groups to carry spare water/clothes if necessary • Monitor group throughout the day
4	2	<p>Getting lost</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advise students to stay in groups of 3 or more • Give each group a map and orientate each group on arrival • Give group mobile contact • Ensure group are aware of meeting point and time
5	2	<p>General public</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advise group to be polite to any members of the general public they may come across • Give group mobile contact • Advise students to stay in groups of 3 or more
