OVERVIEW

This session is designed to let pupils explore concepts of interdependence and movement on a global and local scale through the example of food. Pupils will gain an appreciation for the distance some common foods have travelled and the impact of this on people, places and the environment, as well as foods that can be produced in the UK/Republic of Ireland. To conclude the day, pupils will use what they have learned to 'invent' a new food, produce advertising posters, and consider the impact of this food product on the environment and people across the world.

4 hour session

Protecting fieldwork opportunities for everybody


Growing pressures on outdoor learning has led the FSC to take on an important role; championing the rights and opportunities for people of all ages to experience the environment at first hand.
