17th – 19th April FSC Kindrogan Friday 4pm – Sunday 2pm

This is a joint event with FSC Members and Friends of Kindrogan. Arrive on Friday late afternoon or in time for dinner which will be followed by a talk by FSC Head of Scotland Daniel Moncrieff. Saturday explore the area around the Centres including a guided walk and a chance to observe the resident red squirrels. Sunday morning you can either take part in gardening activities with the Friends of Kindrogan or enjoy a guided walk or depart. Program ends after lunch

28th May FSC London Region Bushy Park Thursday 2pm - 4.30pm

FSC delivers the education in three of London's Royal Parks. This is an opportunity to find out about FSC's work in Bushy Park. Simon Ward, Head of FSC London Region will talk about our plans to develop and widen FSC's work in the London area. There will be a guided walk in the park followed by tea and cakes.

26th – 27th July FSC Malham Tarn Sunday 4pm – Monday 4pm

Arrive in time for tea and a leisurely wander around the Centre and its grounds learning more about recent renovation work undertaken at High Stables and the research taking place around the tarn. After dinner there will be a talk on the research including the changes in farming practice. On Monday there will be a guided walk down through spectacular limestone scenery to Malham village looking at some of the research sites with an opportunity for tea and cake at the end. You may wish to consider booking into one of natural history courses which are starting on the Monday evening these include David Brown's Butterflies and Moths, a digital photography course for beginners and an introduction to freshwater invertebrates.

8th – 11th August FSC Orierton Saturday 4pm – Tuesday 9.30am

A new opportunity for members this year - an **FSC Members' course at FSC Orierton**. This course has been developed in response to feedback from members offering you the chance to take part in a course but with the option of taking time out in the afternoon if you wish.

Arrive Saturday afternoon in time for tea. Following dinner there will be a talk. On Sunday Chris Millican, Head of Centre, will lead a morning activity returning to the centre at lunch time and then in the afternoon Chris will lead another activity or you can relax in the Centre. Dinner will be followed by bat watching and a chance for you to 'play' with some of the technology used by students who visit Orierton. On Monday Mark Ward, Education Team Leader, will lead the day with a focus on all things marine and once again those who wish to relax can opt out of the afternoon activity. Following dinner there will be a talk and the chance to

watch the bats once again. The course ends after breakfast on Tuesday and you are welcome to make a pack lunch to take with you.
