<b>Role Title:</b>	Education Leader Volunteer
<b>Where:</b>	FSC London at the following locations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bushy Park (one of The Royal Parks)</li> </ul>
<b>When:</b>	Ongoing
<b>Commitment:</b>	Flexible; we ask for a regular commitment. Opportunities are available on weekdays, mainly during term time. We also run some family activities during the holidays and weekends. Sessions generally run between 09:30 – 1600 but vary depending upon the age group.
<b>Why We Want You:</b>	<p>We are looking for volunteers to help our educational team by leading and delivering environmental education activities, providing an opportunity for people of all ages and abilities to enjoy and learn through first hand experiential activities. Activities include pond dipping, minibeast hunts and sensory activities. Other activities you may lead include guided walks, community engagement events, family activity days and supporting the delivery of natural history and arts courses.</p> <p>Responsibilities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lead on and assist with the delivery of sessions to an agreed FSC standard;</li> <li>• Take an active role in delivery of a range of activities for the local community;</li> <li>• Assist in setting up resources for groups and clearing away after the visit;</li> <li>• Prepare relevant resources and worksheets;</li> <li>• Use your knowledge of the locations to suggest activity ideas;</li> <li>• Share activity ideas with others to develop an activity resource bank;</li> <li>• Help to maintain and repair resources and equipment;</li> <li>• Undertake training required to fulfil this role;</li> <li>• Attend training events to share best practice and improve team performance;</li> <li>• Support FSC staff in meeting Environmental, Health and Safety and Quality external benchmarking;</li> <li>• Help to ensure a happy, productive working environment.</li> </ul>
