JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title: FSC BioLinks Project Officer (South East)

FSC grade: Senior Team Member

Location: South East England (specific base negotiable)

Overall Job purpose

To deliver FSC's charitable mission by producing biodiversity engagement and training courses and managing their delivery through the FSC BioLinks project.

Effective nature conservation decisions depend on the availability of good quality and robust information. Current trends are measured in biological records. FSC BioLinks is creating more records with increased accuracy and focuses on those species that are currently data deficient. As a result of stronger data sets the natural heritage will be better managed, heritage will be more accurately recorded, and a community of volunteers will grow stronger.

Over 2000 volunteers will be involved, bringing together a number of dispersed volunteers, with skills in biological recording and biological identification, and new volunteers. Success will achieve accessible learning outcomes for target audiences by developing/upscaling structured learning pathways.

This includes providing support for learners and links to partners organisations and FSC Publications. Our learners will earn recognition and accreditation and take on personal, volunteer, and professional roles that record and protect the natural environment. The post will include the need to travel to FSC locations and other venues throughout the UK, which will involve some overnight stays.

Key responsibilities

- Working under the direction of the FSC BioLinks Project Manager to produce, manage and deliver engagement and training courses and learning pathways through FSC's online learning platform (Moodle), at FSC centres, and other learning spaces.
- Contributing to the design and implementation of marketing plans to attract and retain learners.
- Contributing to developing and maintaining training standards for tutors and links with national learning frameworks.
- Achieving excellent working relationships with FSC team members, including other engagement staff, co-ordinators, centres, marketing, human resources, finance, publications, and Eco Skills.
- Supporting the FSC BioLinks Project Manager in the management of allocated external relationships with subject experts, associate tutors, partner organisations, natural history and art communities, and other stakeholders.
- Supporting the FSC BioLinks Project Manager to manage allocated budget, spend and reporting.
- Contributing to the collation and presentation of FSC's scale, impact, and learnings for internal and external audiences. This includes working on monitoring, evaluation, case studies and advocacy.
- Supporting the development and fundraising for FSC's engagement and training offers.
- Undertaking any other duties that may be reasonably required to assist with other teams across the
 organisation, and complying with all reasonable directions that may from time to time be given.

General

- Due to the nature of the post it is beneficial that the post holder is able to drive. To drive FSC vehicles you will need to be 21 years or over, have a full valid driving licence, to have been driving for at least two years, and undertake an internal assessment on commencement in the role. SUMMARY OF MAIN TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Contract Term:

This is an externally funded post (National Lottery Heritage Fund) which is offered on a fixed-term basis until 31 January 2023.

Remuneration:

FSC Grade: Senior Team Member.

FSC Salary Grade: Scale Points 16 - 19, currently £23,045 - £26,300 per annum.

The point of entry within the salary grade will be dependent upon qualifications and experience. Further incremental progression within the grade will be subject to meeting required standards and satisfactory individual performance reviews.

The salary is paid monthly in arrears by BACS transfer. The salary scale is reviewed annually.

Hours of work:

The hours of work are based on a notional average of 37.5 hours per week. The weekly hours <u>will</u> fluctuate throughout the year according to business needs. This means that the post holder may be required to work additional hours per week during busy periods and considerably less in other weeks to compensate. Evening, weekend and Bank Holiday working will be required.

There is an expectation that the post holder will occasionally have to travel to other FSC locations or meeting venues within the UK. Where this is required this would be agreed in advance and appropriate notice would be given.

Annual & Bank Holidays:

The holiday year runs from 1 January to 31 December each year. You will accrue an entitlement to paid annual holidays equivalent to 5.6 working weeks during a complete holiday year. This entitlement includes the Public/Bank holidays or substitute days (as defined in FSC's Employee Handbook) when they fall on a contractual or scheduled day of work. Anyone who joins part way through the year will receive a pro-rata entitlement of the 28 days.

In addition to the above, we recognise and reward staff loyalty by awarding additional paid leave days, based on length of service, up to a maximum cumulative total of 5 additional days paid leave.

Pension:

The post-holder will be eligible to join one of FSC's Pension schemes.

Sickness:

During periods of certified sickness the post-holder will be eligible to receive sick pay in accordance with FSC's sickness absence procedures. The payment of sick pay is subject to compliance with FSC's rules for the notification and verification of sickness absence, details of which will be provided to the successful applicant upon commencement of employment.

Additional Employee Benefits:

Probationary Period:

This post has a 6 month probationary period, during which your suitability for the post will be assessed.

Post Classification / Criminal Records Check Requirements:
