



Health And Safety Policy Summary Statement

Field Studies Council embraces a culture of safety with a view to upholding its Values and achieving its charitable purposes for public benefit, as well as complying with applicable law.

Field Studies Council:

- Ensures the health, safety and welfare at work of Field Studies Council employees¹, visitors² and customers attending activities, and courses organised by the FSC;
- Provides adequate control of the health and safety risks arising from our work activities;
- Consults with FSC employees on matters affecting their health, safety and welfare;
- Provides and maintain safe plant and equipment;
- Provides information, instruction and supervision for FSC employees and persons attending activities and courses organised by the Field Studies Council;
- Ensures all employees are competent to do their tasks, and to give them adequate training;
- Aims to prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health;
- Maintains safe and healthy working conditions.

We ask all our customers, employees and other visitors to adhere to our Health and Safety Policy:

- by working safely and efficiently;
- by using the protective equipment provided and by meeting statutory obligations;
- by reporting incidents that have led or may lead to injury to people or damage to property, plant or equipment;
- by adhering to the FSC's Procedures, for securing a safe workplace;
- by assisting in the investigation of accidents, incidents and "near misses" with the aim of introducing new measures to prevent a recurrence.

Field Studies Council Managers at all levels, and the Health and Safety Officer, welcome feedback from customers, employees and other visitors.
