Juniper Hall

Juniper Hall is a superb country house dating from the 17th century set in a peaceful wooded valley. It is situated in an unspoilt area of the chalk North Downs and at the edge of Box Hill, Surrey. Being in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, many amazing rivers, deciduous woodlands and grasslands can be found on the doorstep. The Centre has a rich history; during World War II the house was occupied by the Canadian army in the build up to the Normandy landings. It is within easy reach of central London (less than 10 minutes from the M25) yet peaceful and secluded. There are places to relax during any free time such as a lounge, games room and outdoor spaces.

All types of bookings are welcome including singles, couples, groups of adults, youth groups, families and extended family groups. However, please note that we do not accept stag or hen parties. Groups have the option to book B&B or Full Board. There is also a range of break rooms, meeting rooms and classrooms available for group use.

Music/noise	Please respect neighbours and staff that live on site when staying at the centre and keep any noise to a reasonable level after 22:00. If you are planning on playing music after 23:00, you may need to apply for a late licence from Surrey County Council.
Outdoor activities	It is possible to book activities for both adults and children during your stay (subject to availability). These are at an additional cost and must be booked in advance. Please ask for more information.

Broadwood Capacity 16. Approx 5.5m x 5m (area 27.5m2). Quite a small room - snug. No room to squeeze more in. Separate entrance via side of building. Also joins to Ellis via internal door.

Coach House: Located in-between Sankey & Ellis classrooms. Male/Female toilet – there are two cubicles and one sink. There is one separate disabled toilet and sink

East & West: There are no toilets in this block

Main House downstairs: Male & female toilets, both have three full length cubicles (no urinals) & two sinks. All other toilets are in the bedroom areas.

By road – From the north: From the junction 9 of the M25 take the A24 towards Dorking. At the Givons Grove roundabout turn left to continue on the A24 south towards Dorking for approximately 1 mile then take the B2209 left into the village of Mickleham. Go through the village past the Church and the Running Horses pub and continue for about ½ mile. The entrance to Juniper Hall is on the left-hand side immediately after Headley Lane. Please note that there is no entrance to the centre from Headley Lane.

By train - Dorking Station (1.6 miles) - regular trains from London (Victoria and Waterloo) and Horsham. Taxis are readily available outside the main station. Dorking Deepdene (1.6 miles) – trains from Reading, Guildford, Gatwick, Redhill and Reigate. Box Hill and Westhumble Station (one mile).

By bus - The 465 service runs between Dorking (opposite the main train station) to Kingston-upon-Thames and stops outside the centre.
