Start Bay

Start Bay is part of the Field Studies Council, an environmental education charity dedicated to helping people of all ages to experience the environment at first hand; to discover, explore and be inspired by the natural world. It is a separate self-contained property situated at the top of the village, surrounded by beautiful countryside.

The beach is about a mile from the centre with a steep gradient down. Coaches cannot access the village or Slapton Sands through the village. From the Start Bay Centre, you can access the ancient woodland (only accessible to people who stay on site). The property sleeps 41 guests in eight bedrooms, with a large, secluded and enclosed garden including a low ropes course, pond and barbecue area.

The building and village also feature in Michael Morpugo's book Adolphus Tips. It was once used as a school which closed in the 70's. The Field Studies Council bought the property from Devon County Council in 2011 and it hosts the majority of our primary school residentials, self-catering and venue hire.

Start Bay is a stone's throw from the unspoilt and picturesque coastline of South Devon. It is located on the Start Bay coast and is surrounded by the 210-hectare Slapton Ley National Nature Reserve that includes the 4km long Slapton Sands beach and the largest freshwater lake in the Southwest.

All types of bookings are welcome including singles, couples, groups of adults, families and extended family groups on a self-catering basis. However, please note that we do not accept stag or hen parties.

Grounds	The centre is located within beautiful, landscaped grounds with seating areas, large, enclosed garden and wildlife areas. The centre adjoins the 210-hectare National Nature Reserve that includes the 4km long Slapton Sands beach and the largest freshwater lake in the Southwest. There is an outdoor firepit, low ropes course and large secluded garden for outdoor games. There is also an area for camping and a safe, fenced in pond area.

Nearest pharmecies/ surgeries/hospital	Pharmacy-Kingsbridge and Dartmouth 8 miles. Chillington surgery, 4 miles. Derriford hospital, (Plymouth) A&E, 30 miles (56 mins).
Local area	Slapton Village is a short walk away which provides a range of facilities including a community village shop selling fresh produce and two pubs (the Queens Arms and Tower Inn). For walkers and cyclists both the Southwest Coast Path and NCN 28 run close by. Cafes and additional pubs are situated at Torcross with spectacular views out to sea, a short drive (5 minutes). Dartmouth and Kingsbridge are 8 miles away and can be accessed by bus or car. Totnes is 35 minutes by car and Salcombe is 30 minutes by car. Exeter and Plymouth are an hours' drive. The nearest supermarkets/banks can be found in Kingsbridge and Dartmouth 8 miles away.

Directions

By car - The property is situated about two hours from Bristol, 1 hour from Exeter, 30 minutes from Plymouth if coming by car. 20 miles (30km) from A38. Take the A384 to Totnes. Turn right onto A381 to Harbertonford/Kingsbridge. Turn left onto A3122 to Dartmouth. Continue past Dartmouth Golf club on left, then turn right at signs for Slapton. Continue for 5 miles along coast, then turn right for Slapton village. The Field Studies Centre is located on the right, approximately 1 km from the main road.

By train -The nearest train station is Totnes (13 miles). Totnes Station is on the Southwest Main Line and is under 3 hours direct from Birmingham New Street and London Paddington. You could then use a taxi service, which takes around 30-40 minutes, to reach the Start Bay Centre.

By bus - The no. 3 bus Service from Plymouth or Dartmouth to Slapton via Kingsbridge is operated by Stagecoach. The bus stops on Slapton Line and at the village bus stop outside the main Field Studies Centre a few minutes' walk away.

On foot/bicycle - For the more energetic, the Nature Reserve is on the route of a national trail, the Southwest Coastal Path and near Route 28 of the Sustrans National Cycle Network.
