<b>Care: Everyone should be encouraged to care for themselves, others and the environment.</b>	
<i>What this might mean for you:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Following the Country Code and respecting organisms and their environment</li> <li>• Using appropriate language and behaviour</li> <li>• Being quiet at appropriate times</li> <li>• Respecting the fabric of the building</li> <li>• Showing courtesy to other people</li> </ul>
<i>What this might mean for Field Studies Council staff:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explaining why we do things the way we do</li> <li>• Listening to participants views</li> <li>• Being organised</li> </ul>
<b>Responsibility: Everyone has a responsibility to contribute to a positive, enjoyable and safe learning environment for all.</b>	
<i>What this might mean for you:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Helping other people</li> <li>• Listening and following instructions</li> <li>• Looking after equipment</li> </ul>
<i>What this might mean for Field Studies Council staff:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Preparing sessions that enable learning</li> <li>• Showing participants how to carry or use the equipment</li> <li>• Advising participants how to move around site e.g. not running in certain places</li> <li>• Ensuring clarity in the instructions that are given</li> <li>• Ensuring participants are informed of significant risks</li> </ul>
<b>Rights: Everyone has a right to learn in a safe, inclusive and fair environment.</b>	
<i>What this might mean for you:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Following your organisation's rules</li> <li>• Asking questions if you do not understand</li> <li>• Participating and contributing to sessions</li> </ul>
<i>What this might mean for Field Studies Council staff:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Knowing the activity and field sites well</li> <li>• Explaining things a different way</li> <li>• Having appropriate training e.g. first aid</li> </ul>
