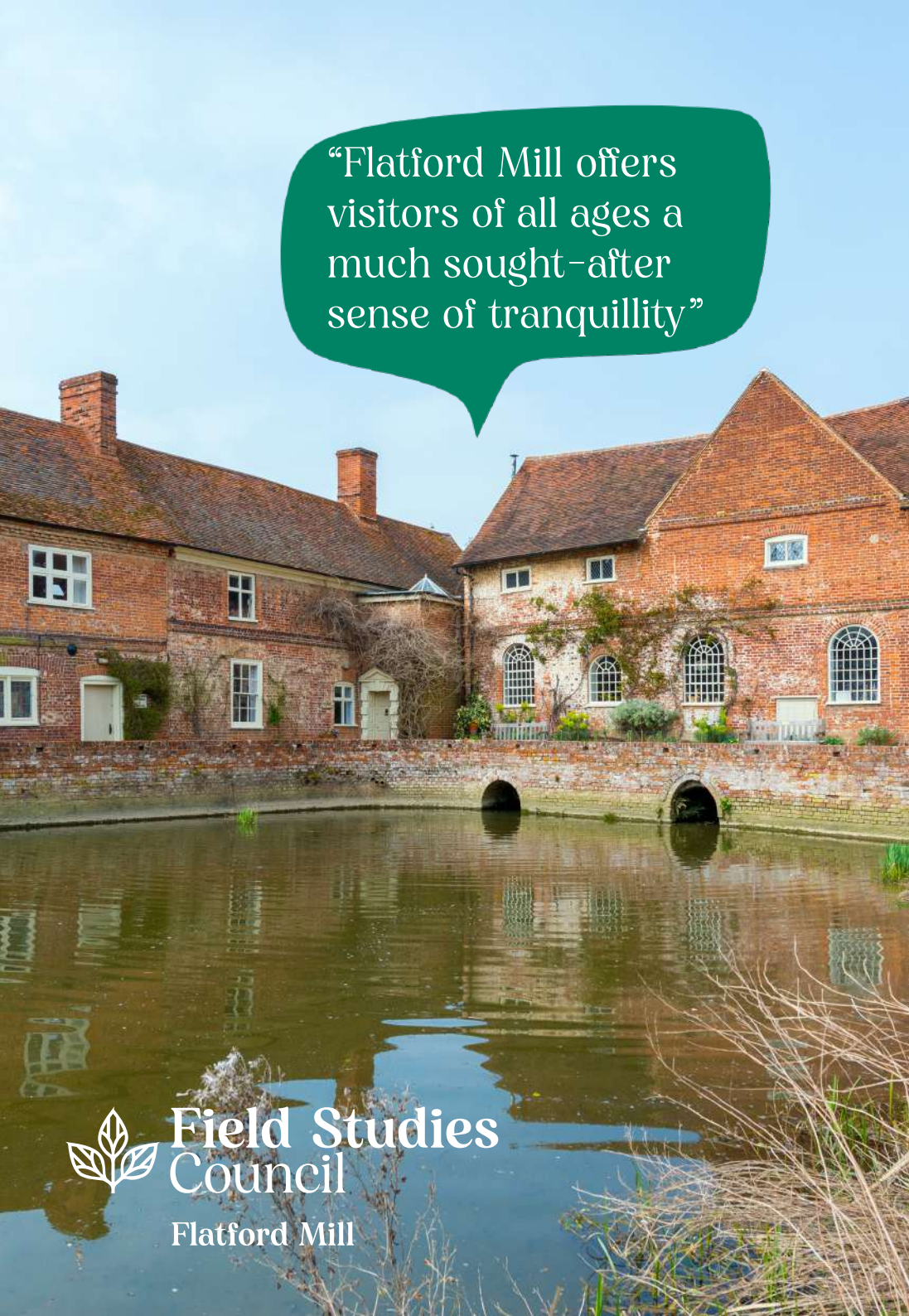




“Flatford Mill offers visitors of all ages a much sought-after sense of tranquillity”

Flatford Mill is located amidst the quintessentially English countryside of the Dedham Vale. It is only an hour from London with excellent road and rail access. The Centre is set across four buildings in beautiful John Constable country in Suffolk. The Mill and Willy Lott's House are instantly recognisable since they feature in many paintings by Constable (location of his Haywain Painting). It is situated at the end of a lane which has no through traffic and offers visitors of all ages a much sought-after sense of tranquillity sitting on the banks of the River Stour.

Its 7 hectares of grounds include riverside and lake margins, woodland and grassland, quiet areas with picnic benches all connected by circular walks. It is within close proximity to Heaths National Landscape and Flatford Mill is the first and original field study centre set up in the UK during the 1940's. It uses 100% green electricity and aims to be as eco-friendly as possible.

This centre welcomes all types of bookings including singles, couples, groups of adults, families and extended family groups. However, please note that we do not accept stag or hen parties. Groups have the option to book B&B, Full Board or it is possible to rent out the whole centre exclusively on a fully catered basis only. (Please note, accommodation at The Mill is currently not available when hiring the whole centre exclusively).

Bed capacity	74 across 3 buildings
No Bedrooms	21. We have three buildings that are used for accommodation. Whilst most rooms are either en-suite or have a dedicated bathroom, there are some rooms in The Mill that share showers and toilets at the end of the hall.
No. en-suites	10
Accessible rooms	Please be aware that due to the age of the buildings and their historical status, if you have any mobility issues you may struggle. Please make staff aware of any health or mobility requirements when you book. Bedrooms in the Babergh Bungalow are accessible.
Accessible spaces	To access the dining room in The Mill, a wheelchair would need to come through the kitchen. We only have one class/workroom that is fully accessible called 'Edwards'.

Linen	We do supply all linen but we do not provide a bed-making service for exclusive centre hire. Can all guests strip their beds upon departure to assist our hospitality teams.
Guest towels	We ask guests to bring towels (although these can be provided for a modest charge).
Kitchen	A fully equipped kitchen which is used regularly to cater for a wide range of groups and sizes.
Dining capacity in one sitting	The Centre has a large dining room in The Mill with big tables, benches and chairs - can seat 60 in one sitting.
Recreation room and library	These are the only common areas – informal capacity is 20 max. The Recreation Room hosts table tennis and table football games as well as sofas, television, TV, DVD player and films, books and board games. The library has an extensive range of reference books with an easy reference database, along with chairs and pcs with internet connection.
Classroom/work rooms	There are five workrooms of varying size seating 15-30. Constable (x30), Ennion (x20), Bingley (x22), River (x15), Edwards (x24).

Conference space	The largest room is Constable, seating 30. There is a nearby village hall that could also be suitable. Please get in touch for more information.
Onsite Bar	There is a licensed bar stocked with local ales, wines and soft drinks – cash only.
Drying room and laundry facilities	No
Onsite shop	There is a small shop on-site selling postcards, Field Studies Council publications, books and small gifts. It does not sell art materials but does hold a small stock of paper. It is located in Reception and will be open during Reception opening hours.
WiFi	Free guest WIFI is available through-out the centre.
Parking	There is a private carpark for visitors which is located at the rear of the site. It can park up to 30 cars. Coaches are able to park at the National Trust car park.
Bike storage	No – but most buildings (except Babergh) do have a communal area where bikes can be stored in the building.
BBQ/firepit	Campfire on site – but requires supervision and is led as an activity by Field Studies Council staff. Must be arranged in advance – fee will apply.
Pets	Pets are not usually allowed. Special arrangements will be made for guide dogs.
Smoking	There is no smoking or vaping allowed anywhere except in designated areas outside. Smoking or vaping indoors will set off the alarms.
Grounds	There is an outdoor games field close by. The seven hectares of grounds include riverside and lake margins, woodland and grassland, all connected by circular walks & quiet areas with picnic benches.
Space for marquee	No
Commercial filming	Requires approval.
Music/noise	Please keep noise to a minimum between 11pm and 7am.
Outdoor activities	It is possible to book activities for both adults and children during your stay (subject to availability), these are chargeable and must be booked in advance. Please ask for more information.
Nearest hospital	The nearest A+E is Colchester (10 miles away)
Nearest shop/pub	There are some pubs and a Co-op in the village of East Bergholt.

Barbergh Bungalow - sleeps 16 in 4 bedrooms - one floor.

1. 2 single beds en-suite. **2.** 2 bunk beds en-suite. **3.** 2 bunk beds & 1 single bed en-suite. **4.** 2 bunk beds & 1 single bed en-suite.

Valley Farm - sleeps 22 in 6 bedrooms over 2 floors

1. 1 single dedicated bathroom + toilet (bath). **2.** 2 singles 2 bunks ensuite shower + toilet. **3.** 2 singles dedicated shower and toilet. **4.** 3 singles ensuite shower and toilet. **5.** 3 singles 1 bunk ensuite shower and toilet. **6.** 3 singles 1 bunk dedicated shower and toilet.

Directions

By road - The Centre is located between Colchester and Ipswich and is about 10 miles from each, approximately 2 miles from the A12. From London take the A12, which is the main access route to Suffolk. Take the B1071 marked East Bergholt and Hadleigh, at the bottom of the slip road turn left. As you enter the village of East Bergholt continue on the main road through the village and out the other side. Take the first turning on the right, Gandish Road, follow this down to a crossroads and go straight over, this will take you into a narrow, one-way lane. After approx. ½ mile you will see the National Trust Car Park for Flatford on your left, just before this is a lane to the left signposted 'Disabled Parking and Field Centre'. You will need to follow this lane until you reach The Mill. Please take care going down the lane to the Centre as it is a popular area and there may be lots of people and families wandering around. Continue driving past The Mill and Willy Lotts Cottage, the trail bends to the right, and the car park is at the end. Please park your vehicle, and then walk to Reception which is located at The Mill.

If you are travelling from north of Flatford, you will need to come down the A12 until you reach the exit for East Bergholt, at the bottom of the slip road turn left and then follow the directions as above.

By train - The nearest train station is Manningtree which is a 15-minute drive from the centre. The East is served by 'National Express East Anglia' and leaves London from Liverpool Street. It is advisable to book a taxi in advance, especially on a Sunday and Bank Holiday Monday. Contact numbers for Taxi providers are as follows:

By bus - The centre is not accessible by a local bus route – it is about a 40 minute walk from East Bergholt where the bus stops. Please note that the lane down to the Field Centre is unsuitable for anything above a 30-seater. It is ok to park in the National Trust Car Park to unload. Coaches can remain for the duration of your stay by prior arrangement. Flatford Lane itself is unsuitable for double decker's.
